#### **PRESIDENT'S REPORT**

Welcome everyone! It's great to be back together here in Knoxville for the 105<sup>th</sup> Annual Flushing Spaniel Show.

The most important job of any ASC president is to ensure the financial stability of the club. I am pleased to inform you the club's financial foundation is strong. Through the efforts of the ASC Board of Directors and

the club's Finance Committee we have established a sound budgeting process and responsible money handling procedures for all our events and committees. By adhering to our annual budget plan, the Board has clear guideposts for maintaining the club's fiscal viability.

In 2023, the club benefitted from several fundraising opportunities at events, online and in other venues helping to supplement our general fund as well as providing additional funds for the Flushing Spaniel Show and our National Specialty.

Dog sports in general are of interest to many, but the number of breeders and breed fanciers who are dedicated to preserving the best qualities of breeds is declining. I hope many of you will join me in trying to find more ways to attract newcomers to our breed and our dog sports. I am a believer in mentoring and educating. Our breeder education forums at the National are well-attended, and our outreach to members of the public at Meet the Breed events are also well-received.



In the past year, our membership has grown but there continues to be a need to reach out to people new to purebred dog ownership and competition to promote ASC and encourage them to take part in all phases of the club's activities. Our members are our best ambassadors of Cocker Spaniels and ASC. Foremost in the effort was continuing support of the cataract marker research at the University of Pennsylvania. The annual research update report is expected at the end of January or early February. The Foundation also participated in several AKC Canine Health Foundation studies.

Last year a comprehensive health survey of Cockers was conducted with outstanding participation and will be used to select and financially support research programs in the future. The survey also made clear there is a need for a health registry for Cocker Spaniels. This weekend the ASC Board approved a Foundation recommendation to work with OFA to support and promote the OFA CHIC database as the club's official health registry. Other breeds have similar programs.

None of our club's projects and programs can succeed without the dedicated volunteers who devote countless hours to ensuring their success. Volunteers bring to the table a wide range of talents, insights, and abilities and through them we find the means to grow as an organization. We are fortunate to have an excellent core of volunteers, and I am grateful to have been associated with them all. They all deserve the club's gratitude for the work they do.

Committee chairs are among those who work tirelessly to advance the causes that promote our breed in a variety of ways. The most visible may be the show chairs who organize and manage the complicated issues connected with the ASC's two major conformation shows (the Cocker Spaniel National and the Flushing Spaniel Show), and our agility trials.

The 2023 National Specialty at Purina Farms saw an increase in entries in conformation, obedience/rally, and agility. It also included popular breeder education programs, a well-attended eye clinic, another fun-filled Foundation fundraising party, and the annual Top Dogs Awards Dinner. Show chair Deann Rogers and her entire show committee deserve the credit for the hard work and dedication that made it a western roundup to be remembered!

The club also sponsored two stand-alone agility trials last year which were well-attended, thanks to the efforts of agility chair Vivian Hudson.

This year's Flushing Spaniel Show is here, and our new show chair Julie Virosteck and her committee have done an admirable job coordinating with the other breed clubs to make the 2024 show a memorable one. The show marks a change to Rau Dog Shows as our superintendent and the ASC Board is working on finalizing a long-term relationship with Rau. The show is dedicated to Jane Williams, the long-time show chair and ASC Life Member.

#### **AKC DELEGATE**

#### Parent Clubs Committee

#### Parent Clubs Education Initiatives

A complimentary ad on every breed page on Marketplace is offered to each Parent Club. Each AKC Parent Club can deploy a free ad at the top of their breed's Marketplace listings page at no cost to the Parent Club. This ad allows Parent Clubs to direct puppy seekers browsing Marketplace to visit their website and/or contact their breeder referral representative.

#### Exploring Options for Existing Local Specialty Club Territories

The American Kennel Club expands existing club territories upon written request followed by inhouse research. The basis for warranting these territory expansions includes household membership shifting over time, event site issues, and the proximity of local specialty clubs of the same breed. Only newly accredited local specialty clubs are eligible for statewide and multistate territories to help newly forming clubs meet AKC's minimum household requirements. The Board reviewed a recommendation to permit existing clubs to expand their territories in the same manner as newly accredited local specialty clubs, provided certain parameters are met.

The Board VOTED to permit expanding territories for existing local specialty clubs with the following parameters:

- 1. Club membership changes and/or event site changes warrant the need for expansion.
- 2. Expansion may include statewide or communities in multiple states if necessary to meet the minimum of 12 local households required for local specialty clubs, as long as it does not infringe on another local specialty club's territory.
- 3. As with all territory expansion requests, AKC reserves the right to adjust club territories by reducing a territory should the breed become more popular in the future and another club in the area is justified.

#### Conflict Distance National Specialty

The current Show Conflict Distance Policy imposes a 500-mile limit on local specialty clubs when participating

with the National Specialty. The Board VOTED to remove the 500-mile restriction.

The committee discussed:

- How more clubs continue to appoint Junior Coordinators so that they can receive information about programs for Juniors.
- How more Parent Clubs are including a feature in each Parent Club magazine which highlights the Juniors.
- How the addition of a Junior Club maximizes Junior involvement and prepares them to be the leaders for the future. Scottsdale Dog Fanciers is one of the two clubs with a Junior Club, Arizona Sunset Junior Club. The Junior Club held its first match on Friday night following the All-Breed show. A luncheon and meeting was held for all Juniors entered on Saturday. The "Best of the Best" competition was held on Sunday.
- How clubs can appoint and train "Junior Ambassadors" to welcome and mentor new Junior Exhibitors
- The development of "Certificates of Achievement" for Juniors who show dogs they have bred.
- The development of breeder advisory groups for Juniors.
- The development of Junior Judging Competitions. The first two were held in Oklahoma and Arizona.
- How the bylaws can be amended to make it clear that clubs may give Junior Scholarships and sponsor Juniors competing at Orlando and WKC.
- How the new subcommittee can update the Junior Best Practice Document.

### Discussion on AKC's take on registration of non-standard colors in recognized breeds

– Mark Dunn, AKC Staff

For the past 100 years, AKC had no oversite over registered colors. Upon computerization in the '90s, this policy changed. Only certain colors were allowed based on a letter each affected club would send to AKC and these were to colors stamped on the registration certificates. In 2004, those lists went online (google AKC Colors to see which colors are approved by breed clubs).

However, registration is not based and has never been based on Phenotype. It is based on pedigree which has nothing to do with color. So, AKC had to develop a way to allow for registration of non-standard colors and did so by including the term "Other" as a selection for the color of the dog being registered. This required a photo of the dog so AKC can determine whether or not the dog in question is a registerable color (not looking at a color, just a picture).

Non-standard colors are not allowed (ex: blue Frenchies, tri-color bulldogs, white schnauzers). You have to have good data, so recording of a problem is necessary to begin researching potential health issues. Mark also mentioned the issues with silver Labradors. Silver Labradors are registered as brown because of a decision to allow this made by the LRC. The LRC is researching the idea of identifying the silver Labrador as a separate breed, but no one knows. In reality, how many silver Labradors there are out there because they are all registered as browns, and there is no verifiable AKC data to shine a light on this issue.

Very few breeds have color exception issues. This is almost entirely the 3 breeds mentioned above. Allowing people with puppies who have these non-standard colors is something AKC does allow.

**Mari-Beth O'Neill perspective** – indicated that problems exist with Dachshunds. The majority issues are with the Frenchies, but the idea is always to maintain the legitimacy of the registry. It was pointed out that the best place to create rules regarding color is always the breed standard. If there is a health issue being created by breeding a particular color, that needs to be addressed. But, if people are upset because a disallowed color is proliferating within the breed, the place to address that is still the breed standard.

**Dr. Claire Wiley perspective** – points out that the majority of time, color variation is not the reason for a health issue. Pigment issues can also cause health issues (albinos or whites). Color is just a few genes. The color is not always the reason for health issues.

**Gale Golden persepctive** – Framingham District KC speaking as a Frenchie breeder of 20 + years. So much of decision making requires data which AKC does not have. Gail pointed out that part of the problem is there are many, many Internet sites and Facebook groups who explain to new owners how to get around AKC's registration rules and register a dog with AKC that is not supposed to be registerable. The Frenchie club has no idea how much of this has gone on over the past few years

because the registration data is flawed. We need to get better at gathering the data we need to really diagnose the problem. It's not a people issue. It's the dog world as a whole that creates the issues. The quality of the data being collected is critical to addressing these issues. No more of us vs. them.

#### **Dog Show Rules Committee**

#### **Items of Interest**

Chapter 15 (Protests Against Dogs)

- a. Note Chapter 10, Section 5 passed at the September meeting. The question was eliminating the word "Show" from veterinarian.
- b. Concern about setting up a conflict by going to a veterinarian who is exhibiting. Committee suggestion that we could add language that the veterinarian could not be an exhibitor.
- c. First and second to add to the end of Chapter 15, Section 1: "Any dog referred by the event chair for examination is excused from further competition at that event or any associated event the same day, the weekend, or the cluster until the Show Veterinarian examination is completed indicating the dog's presence does not endanger other dogs at the event." Motion passed unanimously.
- d. Additional perspective to add "circuit" to the above referenced associated events, to read as: "Any dog referred by the event chair for examination is excused from further competition at that event or any associated event the same day, the weekend, circuit, or the cluster until the Show Veterinarian examination is completed indicating the dog's presence does not endanger other dogs at the event." Motion passed unanimously.

<u>Chapter 7, Section 1 (Judges – Eligibility)</u> and <u>Chapter 9, Section 13 (New Section Show Secretary</u> <u>Application)</u>

- a. First and second that the last paragraph of Chapter 9, Section11 be changed to "Any person acting in the capacity of Superintendent (or Show Secretary where there is no Superintendent) must abide by the eligibility requirements described in Chapter 11, Section 12 of these Rules." This eliminates the parathesis and "where there is no Superintendent." Motion passed unanimously.
- b. Chapter 11, Section 12; first and second that it be changed to "Any person acting in the capacity of Superintendent (or Show Secretary where there is no Superintendent) at a show, or any person

residing in the same household..." Motion carried unanimously.

c. The other portion of Chapter 11, Section 12 will be sent to the committee for further discussion at the next meeting.

#### <u>Chapter 11, Section 8 (Alteration of Dog Appearance.</u> <u>Permitting DQ to Compete in Companion Events)</u>

Feedback from the Companion and Herding Committees postponed. Awaiting feedback from the other committees.

#### **Delegate Meeting**

Selected details from the official transcript of the Delegate Meeting are as follows; The Chair calls on Dr. Thomas Davies, for the <u>Chairman's Report</u>.

**Dr. Davies:** Good morning everyone, and welcome to Orlando. It's a pleasure to be with you all as we head into another historic weekend. The AKC National Championship presented by Royal Canin has the largest entry on record, proving once again that our show is the most anticipated and prestigious dog show in North America. It is certainly the largest, as overall entries for all of our AKC events in Orlando total a staggering number: 9,801 entries

I'd like to tell you about some new developments from AKC that will be important for you to share with your clubs.

Just a few days ago, AKC launched the new AKC DNA + Health. Now, we offer one test for all our breeders' needs. The test includes the 201 markers of the original AKC DNA profile for genetic identity and parentage verification purposes, and now it also includes 328 markers for health and other traits. Our DNA test provides information that is relevant to the conditions that matter most, according to our AKC Parent Clubs. Our test also meets AKC requirements for Breeder of Merit and Bred with Heart. We have two genetic counselors and a breeder veterinarian on staff to answer questions and provide guidance every step of the way, from administering the test to interpreting the results. DNA testing is not required in every situation, but it certainly enhances our knowledge of our dogs and is an excellent addition to our toolkit as responsible breeders. The test is available on AKC.org and you should receive your results in about four weeks.

Last week, we launched a new web site to provide a valuable incentive for dog registration. AKC Pet Rx is an online pharmacy that sells more than 3,000 prescription and over-the-counter products for pets. The service is

provided by Allivet, a website that is fully accredited by the National Boards of Pharmacy, licensed in all states, and has 19 years of experience in pet e-commerce. If you have purchased prescriptions for your dogs on Petsmart. com or WalMart.com, you have shopped with Allivet. Our primary goal with this initiative is to make more dog owners want to register their purebred dog with AKC. With AKC Pet Rx, new puppy owners will receive a free monthly dose of Simparica Trio flea, tick and heartworm treatment when they register their dog and accept this offer with a commitment to auto-shipping on this site. This is a value of more than \$32 for the new puppy owner.

AKC Pet Rx will feature other types of discounts for breeders as well. It is our hope that this website will give new dog owners one more reason to join our ranks.

Lastly, I am thrilled to announce that we have recently renewed our contract with Royal Canin to present this incredible dog show to our fancy and the national television audience of millions of people, for many more years. Please join me in thanking Royal Canin when you see their representatives on the show floor throughout the weekend. Their support is vital to our sport in so many ways

**Mr. Sprung:** The Chair calls on Ted Phillips, CFO, for the <u>Financial Report</u>.

**Mr. Phillips:** Thank you, Dennis, and good morning. Delegates, welcome to Orlando! We appreciate you attending today's meeting and, as always, appreciate your time and support. Today, I'll present key performance indicators and financial results for the nine months ended September 30, 2023. As a reminder, these data points, both non-financial and financial, are essential to telling the story of the AKC operating results.

As of September 30, 2023, litter registrations totaled 226,939, which is 8.7 percent lower than the same period in 2022. For dog registrations, we'll focus on the pink columns on the slide, and for the nine months ended September 30, 2023, dog registrations totaled 480,128, which is 14.7 percent lower than in the same period in 2022. Please understand that while these numbers show lower, litter and dog registrations represent 39 percent of total revenue for the nine months ended September 30, 2023. Once again, we always thank our breeders, the Delegate Body, the Board of Directors, and our Staff for these achievements.

Turning to Sports & Events, we continue to see an increase in the total number of events and entries as displayed on this slide. The dark blue columns report the

total number of events for each period. As of September 30, 2023, total events are 19,981, which is 7 percent higher than the same period in 2022. The line across the top of the two columns shows that entries have climbed by 5 percent over the prior period to 2.782 million, and as you heard earlier, we expect 2023 to be a banner year for events and entries.

Next, let's look at the financial operating results for the nine months ended September 30, 2023. Total operating revenues of \$76.3 million were reported, which generated net operating income of \$10.2 million. As we mentioned earlier, revenues are principally generated by registration and event fees. When you compare the nine months ended September 30, 2023, for the same period of 2022, total revenue is 5.3 percent lower. Registration and event fees total \$53 million, or 70% of total revenue. To break that down, we see that litter and dog registrations and related revenues total \$41 million for this period in 2023, and event fees total \$12 million. Advertising, sponsorship, and royalty revenues total \$14.3 million, or 19% of total year-to-date revenue, which is comparable with the same period in 2022. Operating expenses, as of September 30, 2023, total \$67.9 million, which is 10 percent higher than the same period in the prior year. We follow a very tight cost control methodology across all categories and ensure that expenses are kept at appropriate business levels. Half of total operating expenses are related to staff expense and travel costs, and total \$33.6 million, which is 17 percent higher than 2022, representing AKC's efforts of investment in the future. All programs and activities listed here have available funds and are in line with the 2023 budget. Our Government Relations Staff promotes the mission of AKC through its continuing support of legislation at the state and federal levels and is sufficiently funded. Annual donations from AKC to charitable organizations average 5 percent of operating expenses and are consistent with prior years.

As of September 30, 2023. Total assets are \$253 million or \$9.6 million higher than December 31, 2022. Investments and cash comprised the largest portion of total assets at \$171 million. The investment portfolio, which is professionally managed for growth using a balanced asset allocation methodology, has returned 6 percent this year, beating its benchmark by 1.4 percent. As we've seen, the financial markets are generally improving in 2023 as compared to 2022. The overall financial condition of AKC continues to be healthy due to positive mission-related activities and solid support from the Board of Directors.

**Mr. Sprung:** The Chair now calls on the Executive Secretary to read the proposed amendment to <u>Chapter</u>

<u>12, Section 1 and Section 4, of the Rules Applying to Dog</u> <u>Shows – The Catalog.</u>

**Ms. DiNardo:** The amendment to Chapter 12, Section 1 and Section 4, of the Rules Applying to Dog Shows – The Catalog, deletes the requirement to publish the complete address for judges, replacing with city and state. It also deletes the requirement to publish the address of all exhibitors, replacing with city, state and email if provided. Finally, it replaces the address of the owner with city, state, and if provided, email address, removing the requirement to publish the full address of the owner in the show catalog.

This amendment was suggested by Staff and endorsed by the Delegate Dog Show Rules Committee and brought forward with approval by the AKC Board of Directors.

It will be published in two issues of the AKC Gazette and you will be asked to vote on it at the March 2024 meeting.

**Mr. Sprung:** Are there any questions on this proposed amendment?

The Chair recognized Mary Grace Buckwalter, Belgian Sheepdog Club of America, who spoke as follows:

**Ms. Buckwalter:** Hi, Mary Grace Buckwalter, Belgian Sheepdog Club of America. My question is on the email provided. Provided to whom? Because at this point, the superintendents and the secretaries all have it.

Mr. Sprung: The email that is listed on the entry form.

Ms. DiNardo: If it's on the entry form.

**Ms. Buckwalter:** Anyone who goes green for MBF, that's on the entry form, because we've all agreed to go green instead of U.S. Post Office. I'm wondering if there could be something indicating to publish my email address or do not publish my email address. Thank you.

**Mr. Sprung:** Thank you. If you wish to make an amendment, that could be done at the March 2024 meeting.

#### **ASC FOUNDATION**

Charles Born President and Executive Director

The ASC Foundation is the only nonprofit 501c3 with the mission of bettering the lives of Cocker Spaniels through research, education, and rescue. In 2023 the Foundation worked to achieve this mission through three initiatives.

The Foundation continues to contribute to and/or directly sponsor veterinary research programs to improve the health of Cocker Spaniels by understanding and attempting to eliminate the diseases, genetic abnormalities, and injuries that impact them.

Foremost in this effort was our continuing support of the cataract marker research of Dr. Aguirre and his research team at the University of Pennsylvania. We are expecting the annual research update report at the end of January or early February and will share it as soon as available. We are hopeful there will be some exciting progress. Cataract research was not our only focus. As in previous years, we also participated in Foundation Board-selected AKC Canine Health Foundation studies. These studies are all listed on our website at asc-f.org. Please learn more about them there or ask any Board member for details.

For the first time in over a decade, we completed a very comprehensive health survey of Cockers with outstanding participation. We will use these results to select and financially support research programs and others going forward.

Rescue is another part of our mission. The Foundation seeks to ensure that every Cocker Spaniel has a good

home and adequate veterinary care by providing financial assistance to and promoting a national network of affiliated rescue organizations that dedicate themselves to this mission on a local basis. Our largest rescue effort this past year involved over 40 Cockers.

Another mission of the Foundation is to provide education and information on health and research topics that promote intelligent breeding, care, and knowledge of Cocker Spaniels. Although we have provided Web-based seminars in the past, we are planning to extend this service in 2024 and offer additional health and research-related learning opportunities for the Cocker fancy.

As mentioned previously, in 2023, the Foundation completed a breed Heath Survey, the results of which are available for review on our website. In reviewing the data and comments, it became apparent to the Foundation Board that as a breed we need to create and promote a Cocker Spaniel Health Registry. In previous years, both the ASC and the Foundation explored the feasibility of creating a replacement health registry database to the one lost several years ago but the costs were prohibitive.

We must have a Health Registry and so the Foundation is suggesting to the ASC Board of Directors that in 2024 the most secure and valuable way forward to create a Cocker Spaniel Health Registry would be as follows:

- 1. The American Spaniel Club works with the OFA to support and promote the OFA CHIC database as our official health registry. Other spaniel breeds like Welsh among others are already doing this.
- 2. The American Spaniel Club recommends the following basic health screening tests for all Cocker Spaniel breeding stock and that breeders submit the test results for CHIC certification:
  - Hip Dysplasia (OFA or PennHIP) and
  - ACVO Eye Exam
- 3. As a result of this effort, Cockers meeting these basic health screening requirements would be issued Canine Health Information Center (CHIC) numbers. For breeders and potential puppy buyers, CHIC certification would be a good indicator that the breeder responsibly factors good health into their selection criteria.
- 4. If approved, the Foundation is committed to working with the ASC Board to continually educate and promote to the fancy the value and importance of CHIC and would provide funding for this effort as required.

All Foundation activities are provided through fundraising programs and legacy giving from Cocker fanci-

ers. We maintain close communication with the ASC Board of Directors and have two from that Board sit on the Foundation Board to promote that cooperation. We employ Raymond James to advise the Board and our Finance Committee on financial investments and safeguards. We give thanks for the support given in 2023 by so many and look forward to continued progress in 2024.

#### **ASC WEBSITE COORDINATOR/DESIGN**

As website coordinator I remained responsive to website content requests, such as those from the ASC president and show chairs and continue to update additional website pages as indicated. Throughout the year, I set up many items in the ASC store, assisted users who had website questions and/or needed log-in assistance, updated show information as submitted, and ensured the ASC board meeting minutes were posted to the members' side of the website.

ASC website activities in 2023 also included the following:

#### **BREEDER REFERRAL**

Tom Dowell

The Cocker Breeder Referral has 81 listings for 2023. Sixty listings at \$10 each and 21 listings at \$40 each. The total income for 2023 was \$1,440.00.

#### **EDUCATION - JUDGES**

There were several seminars in 2023. In addition to the seminar presented at the ASC National Specialty, there were also seminars in Washington, Texas, and Tennessee. A Cocker Spaniel Seminar/Workshop was also presented at the AKC Advanced Institute in Orlando in December.

#### **EDUCATION - PUBLIC**

#### Diane Kepley

The American Spaniel Club was represented at a successful Meet the Breeds event in January 2023 in New York City. We anticipate the scheduling of other events during 2024.

The club's other primary method of outreach to the public and ASC members is our main Facebook page, and Facebook pages related to ASC events. The Facebook pages mirror much of the information on the ASC website, expanding the club's online presence.

Use of the main ASC Facebook page in 2023 was the highest in January during the Flushing Spaniel Show. There were also peaks in usage corresponding with updates on major club events. It should be noted that the annual reach in 2023 increased by 18% compared to 2022. Reach is a measure of the number of people who saw any content on the page. The number of times the page was visited in 2023 increased by more than 146% over 2022!

The ASC page currently has 2970 followers, with women ranging in age from 35-65 + making up the majority. North America accounts for 80% of that figure.

Facebook continues to be an important part of the ASC outreach to the public as well as the purebred dog community and the ASC membership.

#### FINANCE

The Finance Committee continues to follow the twoyear budget that was set in motion by the prior finance committee. In general, nothing changed other than to monitor our budget items throughout the year. We worked closely with the Treasurer and the show committees on the general finances as regards to the budget with the actual revenue and expenses. Details can be found in the Treasurer's report.

As a general reminder, for those that are new to the board and for club members an overview of the current process, ASC has a general budget that covers the operations of the club other than the specific show events. Each show event has a separate budget that is reviewed and approved by the ASC Board. The General Budget covers a two-year period, looking forward. We budget both Revenue and Expenses. The ASC Fiscal year is October 1 to September 30th each year.

When the original budget process was put in place, some of the expenses and revenues from the shows were "co-mingled" with the operating budget of ASC. Not only is this confusing, but it is not a true reflection of the core operations of the club. For this reason, I would like to make the following proposal to amend the budget.

I propose that all items specifically related to both the Flushing Spaniel Show and the National Specialty not be included in the ASC budget. Each show should have their own budget, including revenues and expenses. Items that are "reusable" at either or both shows would be part of the ASC budget, i.e. the new table clothes/toppers we will be using in January 2024. I believe that the "Top Dog Awards" should be part of the ASC budget and not the National budget.

A revised budget, excluding items related to the Flushing show and the National will be available for review and approval at the Board meeting.

#### AGILITY UPDATE

As promised from the July ASC Board Meeting, we have solidified the agility flooring plan. Originally Agility was supposed to be in the extension portion of the Norris-Penrose Event Center, but upon our site visit in early August 2023, we decided to move Agility into the main room (which meant it would be on concrete, so securing great flooring was now our next step). Andrea reached out to Douglas Hurley, Sr AKC Field Rep for Agility, and he directed us to Mike Padgett – a consultant AKC uses to build out their dirt floors for high-end AKC agility events. We confirmed with the facility that we could build a dirt agility floor on the concrete and they approved at no additional cost and even offered to take the dirt off our hands at the end of the weekend. Mike provided 3 options for us for his services, here they are:

• <u>OPTION 1 – Consult by phone / email – No cost</u> for this.

Mike would work with the facility folks to help out in any way possible to create a good surface for agility. In this option, Mike can help, but his ability to improve the surface will be fairly limited.

• <u>OPTION 2 – Consult / manage in person –</u> <u>Approx. \$1800</u>

Mike would fly in on Monday and assist with the surface preparation before the event. Mike would also assist in the surface work throughout the event. This should allow us to create a good surface but will be limited by the equipment that the facility has on hand.

#### **STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS**

• <u>OPTION 3 – Manage surface creation and prep</u> with my equipment – Approx. \$4200

Mike would provide the same service and equipment that he does each year for AKC Nationals and CPE Nationals. This will allow him to provide the best surface possible, limited only by the type of dirt being brought in (which he is consulting on – we're sending him a dirt sample). Unfortunately, the cost is very high due to the transportation of equipment across the country.

Andrea's and my recommendation to this Board is to choose Option 3. This would have Mike onsite the entire National Specialty week in Colorado Springs where he would manage the dirt on a daily basis and ensure the footing is fabulous for everyone. Keep in mind that the quality of the dirt was one of our biggest issues in 2018, so we're looking to resolve this in the best way possible. In addition to Mike's fee—\$4200 – we would need to add in the cost of the dirt itself, which is being quoted – delivered – for \$14,000. These additional expenses have been put into the budget. Additional fundraising activities are in place to cover these additional expenses. This requires a board vote.

#### **TROPHY DONATIONS**

Trophy donations will begin in earnest during the Flushing Show (yes, I'll be going person to person, LOL) and then the remaining items will be put up on the web for online sponsorship.

#### **ROSETTE ORDER**

The entire rosette order will be placed this week and should be in hand by end of April so we can start building shadowboxes.

#### **FUNDRAISING**

Fundraising efforts are going well. Spin to Win has raised almost \$14,000 through end of December. Memorabilia sales continue to be strong with many items sold out (yay!). I don't plan to order any new memorabilia—whatever we have remaining will be sold up through and including onsite in July to ensure we sell it all. We have some exciting raffle opportunities coming up including: a Pair of Patron Seats (a \$500 value); 10x20 Free Front Row Grooming Space; a Stack of 200-Size Impact Crates; and much, much more!

#### **OH GALA**

We'll soon be announcing the details surrounding our ASC 2024 OH Gala to be the evening of Thursday,

July 25th, the theme being Après-Ski Party—"A Night in Aspen"—will be super fun and stylish. This year we will offer the option of foreign OH exhibitors to participate. They must meet the same criteria as the US OHs must for AKC's NOHS series.

#### **REGIONAL SPECIALTY**

The Greater Denver Area Cocker Spaniel Club's members voted to no longer host the 2024 Regional Specialty. Mission Valley Cocker Spaniel Club has volunteered to takeover hosting responsibilities at this late junction and has contracted judge Dr. Eric Liebes.

#### **EVERYTHING ELSE**

#### **PERFORMANCE - AGILITY**

This committee serves as a liaison between the agility community and ASC and in a consultative role to the ASC Board. Another important part of this Committee is to promote new membership, which it actively does especially during the National Specialty each July. This committee has assisted many performance individuals in submitting and being accepted to membership, through contact at the National Agility Event. This summer, at least 5 new applications were submitted by agility competitors.

The ASC Standing Agility Committee members, consisting of Stacie Baumbarger, Dana Dow, Dr. Jeanne Grim, Dr. Sylvia Martinez, and Chair, Vivian Hudson, did not have a group in person meeting during 2023 but communicated through email various times. Four of the five members attended the 2023 National and three were part of the National agility committee.

Besides working extensively with the annual ASC National Agility Committee, this Committee also promotes and assists holding ASC stand-alone agility trials. In 2023, two agility trials were in Amherst, NH in June and two in September. These trials were attended by cockers and handlers from five different states. The trials were extremely successful, as entries filled each day and yielded a profit of over \$5,000.

The ASC National Agility Trials are always such a thrill, as so many cockers and handlers come from all over the country. The trials were a success in every way, including financially, as four days ran without a hitch under the guidance and leadership of Stacie Baumbarger (Agility Chair). The 2023 National provided hundreds of agility ribbons, special rosettes, awards, and medallions to some sixty cockers entered on Thursday of the special Cocker Only Day. The committee prior to the National also presented a proposal and received approval from the Board for adding two special agility awards for this and future Nationals with 100% funded by Sylvia Martinez (The Star Award) and The Capital City Cocker Club (The Capital City Cocker Club Award).

As the Committee looks forward to another year, we wish to thank everyone who volunteered in any way to assist in making the stand-alone and the National trials a success. As this committee continues to promote our breed through agility, we again invite everyone to be involved in another year of ASC excitement. The ASC Therapy Dog Committee's goal is to inform, mentor, and give presence to therapy dog teams that volunteer to those in need of comfort, joy, and companionship through scheduled visits to facilities, libraries, events, schools, and any place the teams can make a difference.

#### **STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS**

During 2023, I have written an article in each of The Bulletin publications with emphasis on therapy dog teams, and how they are navigating our "new normal" without being able to visit the facilities in a way they were used to doing in past years. Some teams have been able to begin visiting with health and safety requirements. The articles also emphasized socialization, training, testing, and beginning therapy visits as well as working as a team with their therapy dogs.

During 2023 conditions improved as the COVID numbers decreased, and there were registries that allowed dogs to visit under their protocols. Some facilities still remain closed to in-person therapy visits in part because of the lack of therapy dogs.

Because of the rise in COVID numbers in the last few months of 2023, some facilities have suspended their therapy dog program until things improve. In areas where many dogs are attending events, the canine flu has also had an effect on the number of teams participating.

We encourage anyone who has a Cocker Spaniel they feel has the temperament, loves people, and desires to be around them to socialize their dogs within safety requirements of their area. It is possible to teach basic obedience, find a therapy dog group and certify, and take the dogs safely to places that allow therapy dogs. Training facilities are offering classes and it is easier to enter performance events and socialize young therapy prospects while adding performance titles to their names.

It is the ASC Therapy Dog Committee's hope that our therapy teams can be recognized in some way. It would be an honor to award the title of ASC Therapy Dog. There is an active committee working on a logo for a patch, and a committee working on an application including qualification for the honor. It is a work in progress, and the committee is working toward having a plan to submit to the ASC Board sometime during 2024.

We are positive in thinking we will be able to test more dogs and have more in-person visits going forward. Our goal is also to make people aware of this special group called "Therapy Dogs"!.

#### **TOP DOG COMMITTEE**

#### Jeanne S. Grim DVM

This committee tracks the top cocker spaniels in both conformation and performance events, as well as the top producers.

The Top Dog Catalog has been printed each year since 2005. It recognizes the top cocker spaniels in conformation, agility, obedience, hunting, rally and tracking. The catalog also includes title statistics, ASC awards and a list of the dogs being inducted into the ASC Hall of Distinction.

We will continue to recognize the top cocker spaniels in the top dog catalog and award rosettes to the owners at the ASC National Specialty each July.

Kathleen Egeland-Brock has the task of tracking the top conformation cocker spaniels as well as the top producers. I continue to follow the performance cockers who are busy earning new titles and competing in new events.

Beginning in 2021, all top dog owners who are not ASC members are required to purchase their top dog rosette. All top dog catalogs are printed in color and sold by pre-order only. The budget includes rosettes for ASC members and mailing of rosettes and catalogs to those not in attendance at the ASC cocker spaniel national specialty.

Last summer at the Cocker Spaniel National Specialty we recognized the top dogs in all breed competition, owner-handled competition, agility, hunting, obedience, rally and tracking.

## **NEW TITLES** TO FETCH



#### AKC AND "DO MORE WITH YOUR DOG" EXPAND YOUR PERFORMANCE OPTIONS.

The advent of a new year often brings new title options from various organizations, and 2024 was no different. There are two organizations in particular that have added titles that are fun and don't require hours and hours of training to achieve.

**AKC has added a progressive series of titles to its Companion events called Fetch.** The Fetch titles were created as another activity in which owners could have fun with their dogs in a non-competitive manner. Although some dogs are natural retrievers, not all are, and even the natural retrievers will learn new skills as they progress through the Fetch titles. The higher titles in the Fetch program work on the dog's memory, as item to be retrieved will be dropped or thrown behind a blind (a screen) where it is not easily seen by the dog. There are four titling levels as a part of the AKC Fetch program, and the team is required to pass each level twice before they can earn a title and move on to the next level.

**Fetch Novice** (FTN) requires the dog to retrieve a ball, training bumper (sometimes also called a dummy) or a toy that has been thrown 30 feet. The Novice course has four distractions on it—three are boxes and one may be



a "fun" distraction such as a lawn chair or lawn ornament. The dog must go between these distractions to fetch their item. Each round requires the dog to retrieve their item three times. The handler must throw the item in


any order of the following: to the left of the course, to the center, and to the right of the course.

**Fetch Intermediate** (FTI) requires the dog to fetch their item from a distance of 50 feet. The Intermediate Course has 8 distractions, of which 6 are boxes and two can be "fun" items as outlined above. In Intermediate four retrieves are required. In any order, the throws must be: 1 to the left, 1 to the center, 1 to the right and 1 more

to either the left or right (handler's choice).

#### **FetchAdvanced**

(FTA) is where the retrieving starts to get a lot more challenging! The minimum distance for Advanced retrieves is 70 feet, plus the



course now has three blinds (screens that are at least 24 inches tall and 10-12 feet wide). With the dog sitting at the handler's side, a helper drops a ball or bumper behind each blind as the dog watches. Alternately, the handler may also opt to throw 3 items over the blinds. The dog must do 2 single retrieves and 2 double retrieves in any order the handler chooses. The two single retrieves will be one to the center and one to either the right or the left. The double retrieves require the dog to use their memory.

The dog starts out sitting beside the handler and stays while the helper drops the first item behind the blind. The helper should make sure that they have the dog's attention before dropping the item by using a verbal "Hey, Hey, Hey."




The helper then says "Hey, Hey, Hey" and drops the second item as the dog continues to stay and watch. The handler sends the dog to fetch the first item (order of items retrieved isn't important), and once the dog has returned with the first item, they are asked to sit beside the handler again before being released to retrieve the second item.

The ultimate title to be earned is that of **Fetch Retriever** (FTR). The distance for the retrieves at this level is 80 feet, and the same three blinds are used as with the FTA title. At this level the dog must do 2 double

retrieves (as outlined above) and one triple retrieve. The handler can choose the order of these three retrieves. The set up for the triple retrieve is very similar to that of the double retrieve, other than the items must be dropped behind each of the blinds, one at a time, after getting the dog's attention prior to each drop. This is all done while the dog is sitting beside the handler and holding a stay. Once all of the items have been placed, the dog will fetch each item, returning to the handler with each item, sitting at heel, and then being released to retrieve

the next item. This requires the dog to use their memory as well as some reasoning, to understand where they have retrieved the items from, and which blind(s) may still have an item to be retrieved.



There is more to the AKC Fetch program than the synopsis I've written here, so head over to the AKC website and do a search for Fetch to download the participant handbook. To me it looks like a really fun program that will be enjoyed by many dogs, especially our Cocker Spaniels who tend to enjoy retrieving (well, most of them enjoy it).

The other new title option I wanted to present is the Olympic titles being offered by Do More With Your Dog (DMWYD). What I love about the DMWYD program overall is that the dog's skills can be evaluated by video, so you don't need to live close to an evaluator or make a special trip to show off what your dog can do. With this year being an Olympic year, DMWYD elected to offer some themed trick titles for teams to earn. The first is the Dog Olympics 2024 title, which can be earned by earn-

ing any 5 titles during the calendar year. These titles can be trick, fitness, stunt dog, animal actor or specialty titles. Many of these titles are fun to work towards, and the overarching title provides a little bit more motivation to finally train and record those tricks. Every trick trained is strengthening the bond between you and your canine partner(s) and some are even useful for more than entertainment purposes. This title is only available in 2024, so think about some tricks that you'd like to work on and get training. This year there are 5 new specialty titles being offered, also with a nod to the Olympics, and each title is centered around an idea or a prop. The first title that was released in 2024 was the Hoops title. This title requires the dog to perform 10 tricks that involve a hoop. Some trick ideas are teaching the dog to jump through a hoop, sending the dog away from you to sit inside a hoop, jumping between platforms through a hoop and more. I even taught Bowie how to crawl through a hoop that is just lying on the floor! Your only limit is your creativity in finding ways to incorporate a hoop into your tricks. The second of the Doglympics Pentathlon series titles to be released is the **Balls** title. Like the Hoops title, this title requires your dog to perform 10 tricks that incorporate a ball into them. Again, your creativity is your limit. Some of the suggested tricks are things like paws up on a yoga ball, circling around a yoga ball, balancing on top of a yoga ball, fetching a ball, catching a ball and even basketball. More Doglympics Pentathlon titles will be released on April 2nd, May 7th and June 11th.

If you're interested in making 2024 the year you finally earn some trick titles, take a look at **https://domorewithyourdog.com/DogTricks/list-of-all-titles/** and see which ones you might start working towards. If you have questions about any of them, I'm happy to help you with training resources, but the DMWYD has an excellent **Tricktionary** (and there is also an app of the same name) which provides a breakdown of what each trick requires along with videos for demonstration purposes. There are plenty of resources if you need help training certain tricks, and many of them are free.

#### MICHELLE MAMARADLO'S COCKER SPANIELS: THERAPY DOGS, PERFORMANCE ICONS -BEAUTIFUL AND AMAZING!

#### THIS IS A TWO-PART ARTICLE FEATURING MICHELLE AND HER COCKER SPANIELS.

Michelle Mamaradlo has years of experience training therapy dogs, performance, tricks for entertainment, and even breeding and grooming her dogs. She has established programs for special needs children, the elderly, and she excels in all venues of dog sports.

Michelle shares the highlights of her journey with her dogs over the years. She is still enjoying the journey as time moves forward.

#### Tell us about your beginning with therapy dogs. What specifically made you interested in training and certifying them so you could volunteer with them?

My interest in Pet Therapy began in 1998 with my first dog, Angel. Angel had the unique talent of loving people and children and had the ability to capture and mesmerize them. I was in graduate school at the time and had to come up with a subject on which to write my thesis, and I decided to title it Animal Assistance Therapy. I did a great deal of research on this topic and decided that my thesis would revolve around developing volunteer community programs targeting the elderly, violent and special equipment, such as a buggy, transport equipment, or medical equipment?

Angel went to obedience class. A therapy dog must be very obedient and responsive to all of their handler's commands. She was taught to sit and stay on command, come when called, to leave objects on the ground and not approach them if told not to. She was also trained not to jump up on people and not to be reactive to confusion and noise. These are all very important qualities for a therapy dog. Angel excelled in obedience and earned her CD with all first places. In addition to the obedience classes, I took Angel to public events and watched her reaction when she was around crowds of people. She would wag her tail as fast as it could move and draw people in to surround her. When they approached her, she would lie down and stay there for them to pet her. Angel was invited to ride the float for ElAL Israel Airlines, who I worked for at that time, and Angel sat on the children's laps. She waved her paw at the thousands in the crowd crossing town on the float through NYC. All of Angel's pups attended obedience class, and Oreo earned his CDX

aggressive children, and children with special needs. Angel had two litters, and I kept two from the first litter and three from her second litter. I was armed with my pet therapy team members! I licensed my dogs with Bright and Beautiful Therapy dogs, and we were ready to make a difference in the world.

What type of training did you feel was most important in order to get your dogs ready to become certified therapy dogs? Also did you train with any



with all first placements! All the dogs I have licensed have been raised and trained exactly the same way. Angel, Midnight, Oreo, Pebbles and Bosco all passed their therapy dog test with flying colors!

As far as special training related to equipment I planned to use, I most definitely spent time training all of them to fit in and be comfortable in a Sherpa bag, a doggy stroller and a little baby holder that went around me in front and buckled around



my waist. I used all of these aids depending on where we were going to visit to make my therapy visits more professional. For example, for the homebound elderly my favorite was carrying Midnight in the baby holder on me as even though the client had requested us to come to their house, we might have to pass through rooms that they might not want a dog to be in. I would have her in the baby holder until we got to the location that the visit was taking place. I used the baby stroller primarily for schools so that I could wheel them into classrooms, and dogs could be eye level for small children.

#### In your early volunteering experience, what are some experiences that stand out in your mind? Where did you volunteer with your therapy dogs?

So many experiences stand out in my mind. We went to the senior center in Staten Island, and the seniors just ADORED the visits with the pups. Everyone was trained to sit on seniors' laps, and the seniors loved that. They would tell me about a dog they once had and how much they missed having one but could no longer take care of one. The seniors all loved Midnight because she was the smallest and seemed just to balance herself well on their laps. They loved the way she would focus and look up into their eyes, and they would just melt with happiness. I overheard in the office something about a homebound program and asked if I could volunteer for it with my therapy dogs. They said they would make some calls and see if there was interest. We had three homebound clients who expressed interest. One particular elderly man stands out in my mind. His family was very concerned about him as he was 90 and no longer talked to them and was very depressed. They told me that a long time ago he owned a dog and perhaps would enjoy this. I came to visit him with Midnight, my most talented pup for this population. His reaction was shocking; he talked the moment he saw her come in the room and reached out to her. The look of shock on his daughter's face was amazing. I told him that her name was Midnight, and



I was Michelle. All he wanted to do was hold her. We came to visit him every week, and every week he would have entire conversations with Midnight. He would tell her how his daughter was irritating and always wanted him to eat and take these pills, and Midnight would sit adoringly with him and listen. He told me that I did not feed Midnight enough, and he had doggie cookies that he asked his daughter to buy him. He insisted that she get them. He would put the doggie cookies in his shirt pocket and say, "Blackie, I will give them to you, don't worry." So Blackie was Midnight's name as far as he was concerned. His daughter told me that he now would talk to her and ask when Blackie was coming, what day and how many more days before she would be there. He then had his daughter sit him by the window when we were coming over so he could see Midnight get out of the car. I will never forget hearing him shout "Blackie is here! Get me to the living room!" The difference we made in that man's life will always be in my heart, and I am forever grateful to Midnight for making those memories.

Another experience that stands out in my mind was my volunteer work with children with special needs in a pre-school program. The children in those programs did not relate socially to the world around them as they would be fixated on moving a car back and forth and disregarded the world around them. When Oreo and Pebbles used to come in, the children made sounds and wanted to touch them and hold them. They loved the way they felt, so soft and cuddly. I had the children toss a ball, and Oreo would fetch it and bring it back to them to throw again. I remember seeing tears come to their teacher's eyes as they never saw these children respond like that before. They were interacting with the world around them. My dogs were the best therapists and could reach them in a unique way that other therapists could not achieve.



Another special memory that stands out in my mind is my volunteer program to address violent and aggressive children. We went weekly to an after-school program in Staten Island where they were having a lot of trouble with the children fighting with each other. Oreo, Angel, Pebbles and Bosco were the participants. Angel always came, and the other three were alternated. Oreo and Angel started off that program and made a sensational impact. I came in with them and shortly after we arrived, the fighting among the kids started, and Oreo whined and Angel went right over to comfort her puppy. One of the children turned around and noticed Angel comforting Oreo and told all the kids who were fighting that they had to stop because they upset Oreo. All of a sudden the fighting stopped, and Oreo and Angel had all of their attention. They saw that the dogs got happy and wagged their tails. Just that simply, Oreo and Angel had taken the kids' focus off the fighting. They loved Oreo, Angel and Pebbles, but Bosco was probably their favorite. Bosco was my "naughty" boy who would steal my glasses to chew on them, all the silly stuff some puppies do. The kids in the after-school program LOVED Bosco's naughty side as you could just tell he was always thinking about maybe doing something else. I dressed Bosco in a Harley Davidson leather cap and jacket and the children loved

his sassy look. I showed them that Bosco always played by the rules even if he didn't like the rules.

Pebbles specialized with children with low self-esteem and there was one girl in the program that was very intimidated by the other children. This girl was always so sad, but when Pebbles was there she was very happy. She told me that Pebbles loves

her, and when I asked her how she knows this, she told me it was the way Pebbles looked at her.

## When you have a new litter, how do you choose the puppy(ies) that you feel will be great therapy dogs?

Choosing the puppy from the litter that will be a future therapy dog requires 24/7 observance and careful thought and consideration from the moment they are born. In the early days I followed my instincts knowing what dualities I want and need in a therapy dog which includes a solid temperament not affected by noise, vacuum cleaners, etc. I had many visitors over from the time that were four weeks old and watched which puppy came to see the person who walked in and which puppy played with each other or played with a toy and ignored the visitor. All of the puppies that I kept gravitated to the person who walked in the room. It was the first signal that I might keep them. At 4 weeks of age, I can clearly remember Amber, Midnight, Oreo and Gemma leaving everything and walking to the person who entered the room. Seven to eight weeks old was when I made my final decisions. At that point I would get them all temperament tested with the Volhard temperament test. The test really just confirmed what I already knew. My real decision was made by taking them to a friend who they had not met before, placing the litter down on her kitch-

en floor and observing what the puppies did. I already knew that I was keeping Amber, but I observed Chyna raced to another person in the room and made eye contact and showed warmth and compassion! Diamond, who was a lovely black/tan, was initially my pick when she was born. However, Diamond went to the corner of the kitchen and was not interested. My decision was made. Diamond went to a pet home and Chyna stayed because she possessed the unique qualities to become an excellent therapy dog. In addition, all of my wonderful therapy dogs have had litters and have always produced outstanding prospects. Angel produced Oreo, Midnight and Pebbles; Jolie produced Gemma; Gemma produced Amber, Chyna and Pearl. And most recently Chyna produced Izzy; Pearl produced Gabby; and Izzy produced Beatrice. Five generations of therapy dogs produced from my line!

I look forward to sharing more of Michelle and her incredible cockers in the second half of this article to be published in the June 2024 issue.

The AKC provides each booth with their backgrounds, and, while we no longer plan a "theme," we did represent the American Cocker Spaniel by wearing matching American flag t-shirts, which was noticed by the public. We answered questions on our breed, on differences between various breeds, on why purebred dogs are preferred over mixed breeds, and we even educated attendees on why docking is done. Thank you to the entire team of Marlene Ness, Kim Valvolo, Deb Gunkle, Ellen Toomey, Bonnie Ovnicek and Jim Moritz for braving the crowds and supporting this great event.
















Reign finished at 11 months with three five-point majors, six reserves to majors, one Best of Variety and three Best of Opposite Sex—all shown by Linda, Mike, and Savannah Pitts.

My next goals include starting nose and scent work—and continuing my efforts in fundraising, gift designs and artwork donations for our club.

Many thanks to Lindy, who took us under her wing and mentored us on "everything Cocker".

#### RULES FOR COCKER SPANIEL FUTURITY STAKE

BREEDERS OF ENTRIES for the Futurity MUST BE American Spaniel Club, Inc. (ASC) members in good standing through all steps of the Futurity process (have annual dues paid, no suspensions). Any suspension of a breeder or co-breeder by AKC and/or ASC shall automatically disqualify the breeder(s) from participation in the Futurity, to include any nominations for bitches owned, co-owned or leased during the suspension and any puppies bred or co-bred during the suspension. This includes disqualifying any existing bitch nominations or puppy enrollments and also disallows any future bitch nominations or puppy enrollments during the suspension period. No puppy will be eligible for futurity enrollment from any litter which was bred or co-bred by a suspended member, regardless of ownership. Owners (if other than the breeder) of futurity puppy entries are not required to be ASC Members.

Nominations and enrollments shall be sent to the Futurity Chairman only on the forms issued by the ASC. You may photocopy the forms. The forms state the required payment and information. Incomplete forms will be returned. Fees must be paid in U.S. Funds, checks drawn on U.S. Banks and U.S. Money Orders or through PayPal via the ASC Website. Checks on Foreign Banks for U.S. funds are not acceptable and if sent will be returned along with the Futurity Form. Checks that do not clear the bank MUST BE REPLACED WITH MONEY ORDERS PLUS BANK CHARGES for returned checks. There will be no refunds.

Steps which must be taken to Futurity nominate are as follows:

#### **BITCH NOMINATION**

- Owner and co-owner(s) to include lessees of the dam to be nominated must be American Spaniel Club, Inc. (ASC) members in good standing as of the date of breeding and through all steps of the Futurity process.
- 2. The bitch must be properly nominated prior to whelping.
  - a. Nominations made between January 1 and June 30 inclusive for January Futurity.
  - b. Nominations made between July 1 and December 31 inclusive for July Futurity.
- 3. Nominations may be submitted either through the postal service (USPS) or electronically.
  - a. **Postal Service (USPS):** The nomination envelope must bear a post office cancellation stamp with a date prior to the whelping date. POSTAGE METER IS NOT VALID for a postmark date.

If the postmark is not legible or is missing, the nomination will be considered to be postmarked two days prior to the date received.

- b. Electronically: Forms may be submitted electronically to the Futurity Chairman and must be received prior to the whelping date. Payment must be made through PayPal via the ASC website and must be made prior to the whelping date. POSTMARK DATE WILL BE CONSIDERED THE DATE OF PAYMENT.
- 4. A fee of **\$10.00** for each bitch nominated must accompany the form, in accordance with the instructions stated on the form. If the bitch's due date is such that she may whelp in either the January or July Futurity, you should nominate her for both and include a fee of \$20.00.
- 5. Both sire and dam must be at least 2 years old before the breeding takes place.

#### 6. Health Testing requirements:

- a. OFA or PennHip certification must be done on or after the age of 2 for both sire and dam.
- b. Eye exams must be done on or after the age of 2 for both sire and dam and annually thereafter. Exams dated prior to the age of 2 or more than 12 months prior to the date of breeding will not be accepted. A clear eye exam after the age of 8 for both sire and dam will be accepted as permanently clear.
- 7. Documents which must accompany the nomination form: (<u>All documents must be complete</u> and legible.)
  - a. Photocopies of the individual AKC Registration Certificates for both sire and dam.
  - b. Photocopies of the Certification of clear eyes from a Board certified ophthalmologist or similar designation in the case of foreign entries for both sire and dam.
  - c. Photocopies of OFA or PennHip certification for normal hips for both sire and dam or similar certification in the case of foreign entries for both sire and dam.
  - d. If sire and/or dam are listed in the ASC Health Registry, it is not necessary to forward copies of the eye or hip certification for that animal.
  - e. If the bitch is leased, send photocopies of the AKC Lease Acknowledgement received from the American Kennel Club.

#### PUPPY NOMINATIONS

- 1. Only puppies from nominated bitches, whelped after date of nomination, are eligible.
- 2. No puppy will be eligible for futurity enrollment from any litter which was bred or co-bred by a suspended member, regardless of ownership.
- Owners (if other than the breeders) of futurity puppy entries are not required to be ASC members.

- 4. Enrollment of any puppies must be made ON OR BEFORE November 1 for the January Futurity and May 1 for the July Futurity.
- 5. Enrollments must be made on individual forms issued by ASC and a payment of **\$10.00** per puppy is required. Forms and payment may be submitted to the Futurity Chairman either through the postal service (USPS) or electronically.
- 6. The form will state the complete requirements, including, the name of the puppy, the name of the sire and dam, date of birth, sex, variety and individual AKC Registration Number must be given. Puppies bred outside the United States by ASC members may provide a registration number from an AKC recognized international registry, if an AKC number is not yet obtained.
- 7. Late Enrollment: You may make a late puppy enrollment for a TOTAL fee of \$25.00 per puppy, provided all other requirements are met. Late enrollments may be made through the postal service (USPS) or electronically. LATE ENROLLMENTS DO NOT GO BY POSTMARK; THEY MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE FUTURITY CHAIRMAN BY DECEMBER 1 FOR JANUARY FUTURITY AND JUNE 1 FOR JULY FUTURITY.

#### ENTERING THE FUTURITY CLASS

- 1. The breeder(s) of the puppy MUST STILL BE A CURRENT MEMBER OF ASC in good standing.
- 2. Each puppy shall be entered in one of the Regular Classes and, in addition, the entry blank must also be designated "Futurity Stake".
- 3. A final payment of \$15.00 for each puppy to be shown in the Futurity shall be made to the Superintendent of the Show before the closing of entries for the Show, at which time the Name, AKC Number, Date of Birth, Breed, Sex, Variety and Class of each puppy must be given on the Regular AKC approved Entry Blank, together with the payment of the Regular Entry Fee.
- 4. The ASC is not responsible for any errors made on the Entry Blank and no refunds will be made by ASC.




